Sectional Schedule

All Symphonic Band members are required to attend weekly practice for forty minutes after school (4:10-4:50 or 4:55-5:35). Sectional times will be focused on certain instrument groups on specific days. It will be during sectionals that playing tests will be administered and more individualized help will be given. If a member is not able to attend a sectional due to a school conflict (game/tutorials) you must reschedule for another day **during that same week**. It is important that students make every effort to participate on a regular basis. Failure to attend sectionals will affect chair placements and grade. Repeated unexcused absences may result in reassignment to another band.

Parents, please do not schedule appointments during your student's sectional time. The Hogg coaches and other academic teachers will help solve problems with scheduling, but you must communicate conflicts as early as possible.

Events Defined and Band Placement/Requirements

Clinic

A clinic is a band rehearsal held outside of normal school hours. Clinics are usually held in conjunction with the Symphonic and Concert band's preparations to perform in the various contests and festivals they attend during the school semester. A well-known, highly respected band director will be brought in to work with the band during a clinic rehearsal. This allows us to expose our students to some of the top people in the field of music education. Clinics are a very important part of our contest preparations and growth of each individual student. **Clinic attendance is required of all Symphonic and Concert band students.**

Concert

A Concert is a non-competitive performance given as part of our curriculum. There is no admission charge and student family members and friends are encouraged to attend. The Beginning and Concert Bands will give at least two concerts per year while the Symphonic Band will give three concerts. Concerts are a state mandated part of our curriculum and attendance is required of all students in participating groups. Concert etiquette is also part of the curriculum. For that reason, all band members are expected to remain in the audience for the performance of all bands during the Winter and Spring concerts.

Course Objectives

COURSE OBJECTIVES

To develop...

- Self and group-discipline through the preparation and practice of individual parts.
- Leadership skills, responsibility, diligence and an ability to cooperate with others as a team member.
- Strength, stamina, endurance and coordination
- An ability to make musical value judgements through critical listening. The student shall be provided opportunities to recognize quality of sound, pitch, style, tempo, rhythm, blend, balance, phrasing, dynamics and articulation.
- Skills in using and understanding note values, rests, key signatures, scales, musical terms, signs and symbols.
- The ability to recognize and tune intervals, unisons, harmony and training of the ear.
- Proper instrumental technique, care of instrument, correct posture and playing position, embouchure, good tone, correct breathing, technical proficiency and rhythmic skill.
- Music reading skills and hand-eye coordination.
- Musical sensitivity through performance and listening. The student shall be provided opportunities to internalize generally accepted, authentic performance styles and techniques in music played and heard.
- Creative self-expression in every performance experience.

To interpret...

- Sound, musical symbols and terms from the printed page.

To evaluate...

- The quality of musical performance. The student shall be provided opportunities to evaluate progress toward self-established musical goals, evaluate solo and group rehearsals and performances and recognize quality of sound, pitch, style, tempo, rhythm, blend, balance, phrasing, dynamics and articulation.

Grading Procedures

A student's grade in band is a balanced reflection of musical achievement, technical skill on an instrument, participation in band activities, and effort both within class and at home. The grade is made up of three different factors: Assessments, Class Work and Practice Charts.

1. Rehearsal Grade (Class Work) 50%

Each week you will receive a rehearsal grade that is based on the following:

1. You are prepared for the day (all required at home practice has been completed before the class).
2. You have your instrument and all materials.
3. You are performing or engaged in critical listening skills.

2. Tests/Quizzes (Summative/Formative Assessments) 40%

Playing Tests and Concerts will consist of students playing music on their respective instruments for grades. These are done to chart your musical progress on the instrument. There will be at least 1 major playing test and 2-3 quizzes a cycle.

3. Practice Charts (Homework) 10%

Practicing is the most important thing you can do to improve your musicianship. Through practice, you will gain confidence, learn the importance of self-discipline, and eliminate weaknesses in your playing. Practicing is a necessary part in the development of our Band.

Attendance Policy and Academic Eligibility

Attendance Policy

Any activity which is included in the course objectives is considered curricular. Sectionals and performances are part of the course requirements and are, therefore, graded activities.

Unlike other core classes, it is not possible to make-up most of the activities which occur throughout the year. Attendance at all rehearsals, clinics and performances are mandatory. All absences must be approved in advanced by Mr. Sells. **Advanced notice includes at least three school days for clinics and two weeks for performances.** Unexcused absences will have an adverse effect on the student's grade. If you must miss an activity due to an unavoidable conflict or family emergency, a written request by parent or guardian will be needed. Please submit the request in a timely manner. Requests will be reviewed and excused at Mr. Sells's discretion. Unexcused absences may result in the reassignment to a different part or role in the rehearsal or performance.

Band Hall Procedures

Band Office

Although the band office is meant for business it is not off-limits to students. Students may use the band office for practice if they have permission from Mr. Sells.

Before-After School Policies/Instrument Storage

Students arriving at school who are not practicing must store their instruments and go directly to their grade level morning area.

To avoid congestion, students are not allowed in the Band Hall at any time unless they are practicing in Mr. Sells's office or attending a sectional rehearsal. Every effort should be made to not disturb the rehearsals going on in each of the band rooms when dropping off or picking up instruments.

Instrument Rental Policy

It is recommended that students rent-to-own an instrument from a music store. Music stores offer insurance from damage, loss, theft and store instruments are in new or like-new condition. The music stores in our area include:

Hogg Band also has instruments available to rent from the school. All school instruments are in playing condition but are not new. If you choose to rent from the school, there is no rental fee, but the student is responsible for any repairs needed or loss of the instrument. If damage occurs that would cost more than the instrument is worth, the student will need to pay an equivalent amount.

Trip and Event Etiquette

Razorback Band Image

It is very important to maintain a positive image at all times as you not only represent the band, but the faculty and student body of Hogg Middle School as well. As representatives of our school and community, always strive to be ladies and gentlemen. **You will never get a second chance to make a first impression!**

While wearing the concert uniform in public, students must remain **completely** in uniform: Shirt tucked in and buttoned. For Solo and Ensemble events, students must dress appropriately – slacks and dress shirt for boys; dresses, skirts or nice slacks for girls – **NO JEANS OR SHORTS!**

When the band performs in public, all students must wear the following:

Bus Procedures and Behavior

1. Students may only ride on their assigned bus. Roll will be taken by either Mr. Sells or a parent chaperone before each departure and will not leave until every student is accounted for.
2. Each bus will have a Band Director or parent chaperone. The chaperone is to be obeyed without question and treated with respect, as is the bus driver.
3. Failure to obey instructions given by the band director, bus driver or parent chaperone will be considered a major disciplinary offense and may result in referral to a principal and/or exclusion from future band activities.
4. Always stay in your seats.
5. Keep the bus clean. (All buses will be cleaned by students upon return to Hogg – pick up your trash!
6. No food, gum or drink on the bus unless you have permission from Mr. Sells.
7. Keep language clean and refrain from loud and obnoxious behavior throughout the trip.
8. When the bus reaches its destination, remain seated and wait for instructions from Mr. Sells.
